Kakabeak
Clianthus puniceus

- free draining soil
- protect from snails and rabbits

Sand coprosma
Coprosma acerosa

- good groundcover
- free draining soil

Shore spurge
Euphorbia glauca

- Auckland form, spreading habit
- suitable for coastal sites
- protect from snails

Creeping fuchsia
Fuchsia procumbens

- prefers light shade
- ground cover

These Star Performers are plants of proven excellence in suitable conditions in Auckland. Do your bit for plant conservation by growing some threatened New Zealand native plants. Many make attractive garden subjects.





Napuka

Hebe speciosa

- sunny, free draining soil
- healthiest in windy sites

Muehlenbeckia astonii

- divaricating shrub
- use for hedging or topiary



Toothed lancewood

Pseudopanax ferox

- tolerates wind
- distinctive adult or juvenile foliage

Three Kings vine

Tecomanthe speciosa

- tropical vine
- frost tender
- vigorous

Recipe for success:

- Most grow well in average soils that are not too wet
- Although these plants are threatened in their wild habitat, they are easy to grow
- Recommended planting time is autumn
- The planting hole should be twice the diameter of the root ball
- Plant the top of the root ball at the same level as the soil
- Little ongoing maintenance is required
